Two SABIS® U.S. Charter Schools Receive Renewals

In addition to operating private schools around the world, SABIS[®] is committed to contributing to the quality of education in the public sector. SABIS[®]'s involvement in the public sector began in earnest in 1995 with the establishment of its first charter school in the U.S. Since then SABIS[®] has been awarded the management of seven additional U.S. charter schools with one additional school to open in the fall of 2010. Each of the SABIS[®] public schools operates under a charter for a specific time period – usually three to five years – at the end of which the school must apply for a charter renewal. A charter renewal is then awarded based on the school's performance as well as on its success in meeting set objectives established in its initial charter.

In the 2009-10 academic year, SABIS[®] charter schools operating in the state of Massachusetts were awarded renewals of their charters, allowing them to continue their efforts. Holyoke Community Charter School (HCCS) and the SABIS[®] International Charter School (SICS) each received an <u>unconditional</u> charter renewal by the Massachusetts Board of Education.

This is the first charter renewal for HCCS, which opened in 2005 and now serves just over 700 students in grades K-8. For SICS, the first of SABIS®'s U.S. charter schools, it is the third consecutive charter renewal. SICS opened in 1995 and currently serves more than 1,500 students in K-12.

"The renewal applications for HCCS and SICS presented clear and objective evidence of these schools' success in previous charter terms," stated Mr. George Saad, Vice President - Operations for SABIS[®] Educational Systems, Inc. Dr. Sonia Correa Pope, HCCS School Director, highlighted the school's bright future. "HCCS personnel, the Board of Trustees, and SABIS[®] Educational Systems are confident that the school will remain faithful to its charter and continue to achieve academic success and organizational viability," she said.

Commenting on SICS's charter renewal, SICS School Director, Mrs. Karen Reuter said, "This reflects the school's accomplishment of providing Springfield students with a first-rate education." The charter renewals come on the heels of HCCS and SICS's accomplishments of meeting Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) for the 2008-09 academic year, meaning both schools reached the state-defined standards of academic achievement in reading/language arts and mathematics.

HCCS and SICS are among the other SABIS[®] charter schools in the U.S. aiming to improve the educational system by providing public sector students with a solid foundation of knowledge, skills, and experiences for success in college and beyond.

Two SABIS® Schools Expand Facilities

Expansion among schools in the SABIS[®] School Network is an ongoing process as schools enhance their facilities or expand to accommodate the growing number of students they serve. Most notably, the International School of Choueifat-Amman, Jordan, and The International School of Minnesota, U.S., have recently or will soon experience a major expansion of their campuses.

The International School of Choueifat-Amman, which

opened its doors in September 1997, initially welcomed 200 students. The school's student enrollment has rapidly increased over the years, and it now serves nearly 1,400 students in Pre-K through Grade 12. To accommodate the growth, ISC-Amman recently completed an expansion project, which included the renovation of its Kindergarten Department and the addition of an academic building.

ISC-Amman's revamped Kindergarten Department now boasts a full-service dining area, large atrium play area, indoor swimming pool and gym, multipurpose activity hall, outdoor tricycle track, sand playground, and modern classrooms. Additionally, the new academic building offers a state-of-the-art Integrated Testing and Learning[®] (ITL[®]) hall, which has the capacity to accommodate 300 students.

The International School of Minnesota (ISM), the first SABIS[®] school to operate in the U.S., opened its doors in 1985 and now serves over 600 students in Pre-K to Grade 12. Celebrating its 25th year in operation, ISM has marked the occasion by significantly expanding its sports facilities. Construction has just kicked off on a new soccer pitch and track that will be equipped to support a variety of field sports including high jump, long jump, triple jump, discus, shot put, and pole vault. "We are looking forward to the completion of the new facilities in May of 2011 and are confident that it will serve to further enhance the ISM/SABIS[®] education experience," said ISM Director, Mrs. Sue Berg.

Seventeen students in the SABIS[®] School Network recently received recognition for their remarkable results on 2009 British-based external examinations. Seven students from ISF Internationale Schule Frankfurt-Rhein-Main, three students from The International School of Choueifat-Lahore, two students each from The International School of Choueifat-Cairo, The International School of Choueifat-Dubai, and The International School of Choueifat-Amman, and one student from The International School of Choueifat-Abu Dhabi were distinguished with awards. Students who receive an award do so for either being among the top ten scorers on an exam in a subject in their country/region or for earning the best exam score in a subject worldwide.



ISC-Lahore Students Honored for IGCSE Exam Results

The first external exam on which SABIS[®] students excelled is the International General Certificate of Secondary Education (IGCSE) exam, a wellreputed external examination taken by thousands of students worldwide. In fact, the University of Cambridge International Examinations (CIE) is the world's largest provider of international qualifications for 14–19 year olds. The SABIS[®] students, twelve of whom are currently either in the 11th or 12th grade and two who graduated in 2009, earned recognition in a wide variety of subjects including math, chemistry, English literature, business studies, world languages, and computer science, among others.

Seven students at ISF in Germany were honored in eight different subjects, with one student earning the highest marks in Germany on both the chemistry and physics exams. Furthermore, one ISF student was recognized for earning the highest exam results in the world on the First Language Korean exam, and another student was recognized for the second-highest exam results worldwide on the First Language German exam. "We are delighted and proud that so many of our ISF students have achieved such an outstanding level of achievement in such a wide range of subjects," stated ISF Director, Mr. Angus Slesser.

At ISC-Cairo in Egypt, teachers and students were congratulated and the high-quality SABIS[®] curriculum applauded for providing a solid training ground. "We are thrilled with our students' performance on the IGCSE exams," said a school administrator from ISC-Cairo. "We are striving to continue improving our performance on external exams year after year!"

Three students at ISC-Lahore were honored for having top scores region-wide on IGCSE subject exams in Lahore, Pakistan. "*This accomplishment indicates that our students are receiving the proper foundation of knowledge to achieve high academic standards,"* said ISC-Lahore Director, Mrs. Margo Abdel Aziz.

The SABIS[®] Educational System emphasizes student mastery of mathematics and English, including literature, and ISC-Dubai student, Siddartha Kavya, demonstrated her grasp of

literature on the IGCSE English Literature exam. Kavya earned the HH Sheikh Maktoum bin Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum Cambridge Award as the top scorer in the world. She explained her passion for literature saying, "*I believe literature opens people's minds to different perspectives and also rounds off your knowledge base.*" A second ISC-Dubai student earned recognition for having the top score in English Literature in the U.A.E.

Parallel to the recognition received by SABIS[®] students on the IGCSE exams administered by CIE, two students from The International School of Choueifat-Amman and one student from The International School of Choueifat-Abu Dhabi also received recognition for their results on British O and A Level exams administered through Edexcel. Earning the highest score in the world on the O Level Economics exam, the ISC-AD student was honored with an Edexcel Outstanding Performance Award. "*This is a top achievement which means that no one earned a grade as high as this student,"* commented SABIS[®] Regional Director, Mr. Ramzi Germanos. The two ISC-Amman students earned Edexcel Outstanding Performance Awards for being among the candidates with the highest scores worldwide on A Level Arabic and A Level Chemistry exams.

The SABIS[®] STARS (Student Life Talent and Academic Regionals) Competition was held in the Levant Region, also known as the Eastern Mediterranean, on April 9-10, 2010 at SABIS[®] International School-Adma (SIS-Adma). "What's more, there was a spirit of camaraderie in the air among the students despite them not knowing one another very well."

Teachers from the participating schools, along with regional and school Academic Quality Controllers and SABIS[®]'s Academic Department personnel, took part in judging the events. Given the fierce competition, deciding on a student for the 1st prize STAR trophy, and 2nd and 3rd place runners-up in each event proved to be difficult. "Work presented in the different categories was of a very high standard," stated ISC-Koura AQC and judge, Ms. Patricia Jarrah. "Being in such a competitive environment was a valuable learning experience for our students and they enjoyed every minute," Ms. Jarrah

ISC-Lahore Students Recognized in Country-Wide Science and Math Olympiad

Despite the current tumultuous political climate in Pakistan, and specifically Lahore, students of the International School of Choueifat-Lahore (ISC-Lahore) are maintaining their focus on academics. In fact, five 10th grade students from ISC-Lahore competed in the country-wide "Psi-Fi Olympiad" organized by the Lahore University of Management Sciences (LUMS). The four-day event, from March 25-28, was the first Olympiad of its kind held in Pakistan, where students from 150 high schools and universities across the country came together to showcase their science and mathematics knowledge.

With an aim of promoting scientific development and teamwork, LUMS hosted the event encompassing fourteen academic and curricular events, where each team participated in two elective events and a compulsory one.

In their first elective event, "Math Gauge," a complex mathematical test including problem solving and logical deduction, the ISC-Lahore team placed third among 50 participating institutions. In the second elective event, "Race to Infinity," a scavenger hunt based on IQ intelligence and math knowledge, the ISC-Lahore team reached stage five out of six total stages. In the compulsory event, "Tour de Mind," testing general knowledge, logic, mathematics,

and physics, among others, the ISC-Lahore team placed second among the 150 institutions participating. Overall, ISC-Lahore students were praised for their science and mathematics prowess as they tackled problems that were at a difficulty level of a first-year university course and higher.

What makes this accomplishment more noteworthy is ISC-Lahore's team of five students—Ebrahim Khan, Muhammad Bin Awais, Taimoor Shafiq, Wahab Butt, and Dilsher Ahmed—was the youngest of all participants at

the Olympiad. "Our students' participation was in itself a significant achievement as they were the least experienced among students of institutions from all over Pakistan, with most of them either studying for the A-Levels or working toward degrees at universities," commented ISC-Lahore School Director, Ms. Margo Abdel Aziz. "Yet in the end, our students' knowledge and skills exceed those of other schools as well as well-known universities in the country."

Among other things, the achievement can be attributed to the SABIS[®] Educational System, which emphasizes the core subject of mathematics, among others, and by doing so, develops students' ability for mathematical thinking and an appreciation of the power and use of math. *"It was not a matter of luck but of hard work, incredible passion, perseverance, and confidence that as Choueifat students they can reach higher than many others,"* added Ms. Abdel Aziz.

"*The center will serve the students' needs well, given that external exams are an important part of assessing students' mastery of a subject and aids in gaining entry to the world's top universities."*

Schools designated as Examination Centers demonstrate a commitment to the highest educational standards and support a reputation for excellence among parents, pupils, and the wider community.
