Accreditation for SABIS® Schools

The Internationale Schule Frankfurt-Rhein-Main and the International School of Choueifat – 6 October were approved in June 2005 for accreditation by the Commission on International and Trans-Regional Accreditation (CITA). The International School of Choueifat – Cairo was approved for re-accreditation by CITA.

Site evaluations by an accreditation team verified the schools' compliance with CITA standards and found that the three schools met, and in many cases exceeded the international quality standards for accreditation. The Commission expressed its appreciation for the hard work in preparing for accreditation. Head of the *ISF* accreditation team and member of the Cairo team, Dr. Kelly, commented that "the SABIS" philosophy is firmly implanted in everyone we encountered – a love of teaching and learning."

CITA promotes accreditation and school quality standards and provides expertise in accreditation and school improvement. Regional commissions accredit 32,000 schools in 100 countries and are recognized accrediting authorities in the United States and throughout the world, affecting over 100 million students. Accreditation is granted to an educational institution upon successful completion of a lengthy evaluation process, which includes a self-study and an on-site evaluation. To maintain accreditation, the schools must continue to meet the set quality standards and follow a protocol of self-study, evaluation review, and continuous improvement to enhance student and school performance.

Teaching French the SABIS® Way




As part of its promotion of the living languages of the world, the SABIS® Academic Development Department has developed a new French curriculum for the 2005-2006 academic year.

The new SABIS® French Book Series is divided into four major sections: *Alphabet and Phonics, Grammar, Anthologies, and Readers* with corresponding dictionaries.

Two books are designed for the lower primary, featuring Mistou the Cat. Nosy and inquisitive, Mistou wants to go to school to learn French. From one lesson to the next, Mistou discovers new words and expressions. He asks questions in each lesson to learn more and finally learns to say "miaou" in French.

Beginner students also have separate SABIS® Phonics books, covering the various phonemes of the French language. At the end of the



The SABIS® Grammar books were developed based on the approach used in the SABIS® English Grammar Book Series, where rules are clearly introduced and then followed by specific examples and exercises for mastery. These rules are repeated and expanded upon from one year to the next to ensure learning retention.

The SABIS® Readers allow students to become familiar with the French language by giving them the chance to develop fluency while enjoying classical texts. The readers have been hand-picked based on many studies done by specialists on literary works in France and reflect a content that every student should read.

The SABIS® Anthologies select various passages from classical books that have proven to be all-time favorites for children. Texts from Perrault, Kipling, Daudet, Stevenson, Bruno, Sand, and many others motivate students to read. Comprehension exercises that accompany these texts allow students to express themselves, in writing or speaking. The books are divided by themes, allowing students to enrich their vocabulary in various fields. While students read a passage of "Les voyages de Gulliver", they learn to purchase a ticket in French and travel like Gulliver did.

The aim of this new SABIS® French program is to prepare SABIS® students to sit entrance exams for French universities, including the DELF (Diplôme d'Etudes de Langue Française), the DALF (Diplôme Approfondi de Langue française), and the DILF (Diplôme Initial de Langue Française) tests. This program also prepares students for the IGCSE in French Language and French Literature.

Co-founders Visit HCCS Site



During a recent visit to Massachusetts, the SABIS® Co-founders, Mrs. L. Saad and Mr. R. Bistany, along with SABIS® management team visited the site of *the Holyoke Community Charter School (HCCS)* with Ms. Paulette Dalpes and Ms. Betty Medina Lichtenstein, President and Vice President respectively of the *HCCS* board. Everyone was impressed by the construction rate, which is proceeding on schedule. The group toured the building, checked the work progress, and made some suggestions for modifications. Construction is being completed in 16 1/2 weeks. Normally, a



building of this size (70,000 sq ft) takes six to eight months to complete. When finished, the building will consist of thirty classrooms, an enclosed interior garden space, multiple offices, a gymnasium, and a kitchen.

HCCS will open on September 12th, 2005 with approximately 620 students and will provide a tuition-free education, based on the SABIS® Educational System, a system of education that is rigorous, demanding, and challenging. HCCS will promote cultural diversity and place strong emphasis on the newly designed SABIS® curriculum developed especially for Holyoke. It will aim to generate excitement for life-long learning, will train students into logical thinking, and will strive to qualify every student for entrance into college and university. The SABIS® Student Life Organization™ will complement the students' education, enhance their skills, and develop their responsibility and ethics in order to become effective community citizens.

ISR Students Visit Roman Ruins in Neuss

How can you make history come to life for students? Take them to the place where it all happened! Students at the Internationale Schule am Rhein in Neuss (ISR) students, who have an archaeological site just around the corner, visited the Roman ruins in Neuss. Mrs. Sauer, the archaeologist for the city of Neuss, led ISR sixth graders on a journey 1,800 years into the past.

Using maps and pictures as guides, students learned about the city of Neuss, which dates back to the Middle Ages. First, students visited a museum where they held artefacts, such as the 9th century horse-bone used by the Vikings as an ice skate blade, that they would otherwise view only as pictures in a textbook. Additionally, students saw vases, mortars, and dishes dating back to the third century.



Under Mrs. Sauer's guidance, students speculated, analyzed facts, and drew their own conclusions. After their exploration of the museum, students visited the actual excavation site and discovered the two-facets of the construction of the walls they studied. One side was built with stones and the other with bricks - the side with the bricks was built by the Romans, who had mastered this technique, while the other side, which was built with stones, was made during the Middle Ages. The Roman brick-making technique had been forgotten as time went by and the only way to build

solid walls during the Middle Ages was with stones, which sometimes had to be carried distances of up to 200 kilometers.

As the group prepared to leave, Mrs. Sauer explained the differences between Roman and Middle Age tiles and then allowed each student to take home a couple of them. The knowledge ISR students gained heightened their appreciation of history. ISR's "amateur archaeologists" are already looking forward to their next excursion.



Academics

Following the SABIS® philosophy of providing its students with a high-quality education, students at *ISC-Al Ain* enjoy the benefits of a solid and demanding education. During the 2004-2005 school year, most of the 11^{th} and 12^{th} grade students took the SAT 1 exams and scored outstanding results. Several students who form the core of the SABIS® SLO™s academic section scored above 1400 on the examination with the Head of the Academic section scoring 1580 - a true reflection of the benefit of the SABIS® Educational System.

During Term 3, the efforts of the study prefects in grades 2-9 came through when every student in grades 2-9 successfully completed the Essential Concepts' tests at the appropriate year group *ahead* of every other school in the U.A.E. Success came also for the students in Grade 12 applying for university, both in the U.S.A. and in Canada. Those with a strong involvement in the SABIS $^{\circ}$ SLO $^{\circ}$ achieved notable success in their applications with acceptances to top universities such as the

University of Pennsylvania, Cornell University, and Brown University in the USA, and McGill, Toronto, Queens, and Waterloo universities in Canada.

Cultural Events

The SABIS® SLO^{TM} was active in several events at *ISC-Al Ain* the past year. The final ballet event of the year was held on 18^{th} of May in front of a large and appreciative audience of parents, staff, and students. Dancers from the ninth grade took part in the concert, but it was first grade dancers who received the loudest applause of the evening.

Terms 2 and 3 marked the start of the concerts for the various grades. During April and May, parents had the opportunity to watch students in kindergarten and grades 2-4 give concerts. *ISC-Al Ain* seniors also got in the act with the Senior Talent Quest. The involvement in the Activities Department of the SABIS® SLO^{TM} played an important role in ensuring the success of these concerts.

This year's art display in the foyer of the Administration Building was the result of over three months of talented efforts by artists in grades four through eleven. The O-Level work by the students in grades 10 and 11 caught the eye of many visitors to the school and impressed new parents with its vibrancy and colors.



One of the main cultural events celebrated at *ISC-Al Ain* was the *International Evening*. Designed to celebrate the ethnic diversity of the student body, students at *ISC-Al Ain* spent many hours preparing for this event. With each country showcasing its folk culture, its history, and its food, the preparations for the 2005 event increased in intensity as the time approached.

On a balmy evening, the school courtyard was transformed into a bustling market with family, friends,

and supporters cheering on song and dance numbers and enjoying samples of the varied cuisine produced by the families of the many cultures found among students and staff. The event was designed to share knowledge of the cultures in the ISC-AI Ain community and its success shows in the environment of the school. Working with the SABIS® SLO^{TM} , the various countries represented had the opportunity to showcase their culture and beliefs.

Sports

The winter and spring heralded the start of the annual intra-school sports events. Grade 5 and 6 Sports Day was held at the end of March on the school's athletics field. Some very talented athletes took part with Shayan Shaly showing outstanding talent by winning all of the events in which she participated. For many non-athletes, the highlight of the evening was the tug-o-war where cunning outclassed strength in each case. The



sight of the class teachers urging on their classes to victory showed that competitiveness is not just in the classroom.

As the heat increased outdoors, the grades 2 – 4 sports were brought inside in front of large crowds of parents and families. Alumnus in the Spotlight

SICS, Springfield, MA

Ms. MyDzung Chu, a 2005 graduate of *the* SABIS® *International Charter School*, quietly reflected upon her four years at *SICS*, Springfield, MA. Chu's time at *SICS* was "shaped by memories, learning, and self-growth. My experience at the school has truly opened new doors for me, in working with my fellow peers and learning within myself...SICS inspired me to be an active force in every community I step into".

Ms. Chu's goal, from the very first day in the SABIS® community, was to make her voice heard and create lasting, positive imprints on the community. "Looking back, I have much to be grateful for and many people to thank. SICS has given me the opportunity and environment to be a leader and play an active role in my community."

Ms. Chu realized that if she were a student at any other high school, she would have had to wait until junior year to be really involved; yet, because of the importance placed on student involvement, *SICS* provided her with opportunities not found in other schools. In her first year at *SICS*, she joined the *Peer Mediation Team* because she recognized the importance of helping students reach their own solutions to conflicts. She also joined the first-ever, SABIS® *Debate Team* to develop leadership skills and confidence in public speaking. Her enthusiasm propelled her forward into extracurricular activities such as 'Model Congress' and 'Mock Trial'.
