SABIS[®] to Open New School in Erbil, Kurdistan Province, Iraq

On November 7th, 2005, a contract was signed by Mr. Carl Bistany, SABIS[®] President, for the management of a K-12 school in Erbil, Kurdistan in Iraq. This project is the result of a ground-breaking public-private partnership initiated by the Ministry of Education, who formed a private company and contracted with SABIS[®] for the operation of a school to provide a high-quality, college-preparatory education for all students.



ISC-Erbil will feature a state-of-the-art campus with a semi-Olympic sized swimming pool, as well as modern classrooms, laboratories for the sciences

and IT, a library, and staff accommodation. With plans for a campus that will eventually house up to 2,500 students in pre-Kindergarten through the 12th grade, the school will open for students in pre-Kindergarten through Grade 5 in September 2006 in newly-built, temporary facilities provided by the Ministry of Education.

SABIS[®] Students Improve on AP Performance

Close to 500 SABIS[®] students worldwide took the American College Board Advanced Placement exams in the spring of 2005. Aiming to improve on a 2004 performance rate of 83% of 3, 4, or 5, the top scores possible, these students achieved their goal by earning 86% of 3-5. Ranging from Grade 9 through Grade 12 and attending SABIS[®] schools where a non-selective admissions policy is followed, the 2005 AP examinees showed not only their ability, but also their potential.



Offering exams in up to eighteen subjects, SABIS[®] schools helped their students realize this potential. In thirteen of the subjects examined, 90% or more students scored a 3, 4, or 5. These topperforming subjects include Biology, Calculus AB and BC, Chemistry, Computer Science A, French Language, French Literature, German Language, Physics B-Electricity and Magnetism, Physics B-Mechanics, Physics C, Spanish Language, and Statistics.

Among other top performing SABIS[®] schools, *the International School of Choueifat – Abu Dhabi* in the United Arab Emirates and *the ISF Internationale Schule Frankfurt-Rhein-Main in Frankfurt, Germany*, were among the schools whose students achieved exceptional AP results scoring 94% and 95% of 3-5 respectively.

The International School of Choueifat – Koura in Lebanon was one of the many SABIS[®] schools where students were recognized as AP[®] Scholars by the College Board. Ms. Eileen Lyons, Director at *ISC-Koura*, attributes the students' success to a combination of factors: "*the systematic, focused, student-centered academic preparation provided by* SABIS[®], *the dedication and commitment of staff members, both in regular classrooms and in additional tutoring sessions, and, finally, the talented and disciplined approach of our senior students.*"

Elsewhere in the SABIS[®] School Network, school directors praised the SABIS[®] system and their students' results: "*Our students are eager to take AP courses*," reported Maretta Thomsen, Director at *the* SABIS[®] *International Charter School in Springfield, Massachusetts*. "*The challenging coursework along with the work ethic taught and promoted through* SABIS[®] *helps give our graduates an edge in college and beyond.*" At *the International School of Minnesota*, where students take APs in eighteen different subjects, the benefits are echoed. "*Through solid performance on the APs, one of our 2005 graduates currently attending the Ivy League University of Pennsylvania earned credit for a half of a year's course load. This equates to a savings of approximately \$14,000," reported ISM Director Sue Berg.*

Speaking to a gathering of assembled SABIS[®] Directors in the United States, Mr. Carl Bistany, SABIS[®] President, shared the network-wide results. "*The improvement in AP performance throughout the* SABIS[®] *School Network is tangible evidence that we are all seeking to fulfill one of our core values - continually improving and never becoming complacent. The entire network can be proud of these results. Now, let us make them even better in 2006."*

SABIS[®] Delivers Speech at Education Conference at Harvard University

Participating in a conference co-sponsored by *the Program on Education Policy and Governance and the World Bank*, Mr. Carl Bistany joined education leaders from around the world at *the John F. Kennedy School of Government at Harvard University* on October 5-6, 2005. The conference, "*Mobilizing the Private Sector for Public Education*", provided a venue for the exchange of valuable ideas, discussion, and analysis.

Mr. Bistany presented to an assembled group of international experts in the fields of economics and education. His speech began with an outline of SABIS® views on a combined partnership to enhance education. "Enhancing public education needs the involvement of the private sector," Mr. Bistany began. "Education should," he continued, "prepare students to be functional and productive in the world they live in and to provide them with the tools that allow them to keep pace with change while at the same time remaining functional and productive throughout their lives...A challenge of this size and nature, however, is too great a task for any single sector to tackle alone. Pooling the efforts of government, business and industry, and education providers creates an effective and efficient vehicle to address this issue."

Drawing on SABIS[®] experience in managing US charter schools, Mr. Bistany proceeded to illustrate the existence of barriers faced by the private sector. "*The decision to involve the private sector in education is oftentimes half-hearted and lacks the true spirit of partnership. Charter school laws put the private education provider at a disadvantage and are fraught with rules and regulations that impede optimum performance and discourage participation."*

In concluding his address, Mr. Bistany reiterated SABIS[®]'s belief in the strength and power of combined efforts from the government, business and industry, and education providers. "*The first step is to establish a true partnership in which all partners view education as one of the most important industries of our time and afford it the necessary support and attention.*"

ISF Senior Students Direct the Crucible

The empowering and enduring nature of Student Life was recently demonstrated at *the ISF Internationale Schule Frankfurt-Rhein-Main* where a student-led drama production of Arthur Miller's *The Crucible* took to the stage. The *ISF* Players, a drama group founded by *ISF* 2005 graduate, James Murray, continued the tradition of independently producing, directing, and acting in an annual play.



The Crucible, Miller's dark, disturbing drama about the 1692 Salem witch trials was brought to life by Hazel Ward and Fraser Bowers, secondary school students at *ISF*, who directed the twenty-one member cast from grades 6 – 12 plus student stage crew, makeup, music, and technical support.



Fraser Bowers, an *ISF* ninth grader, decided to continue the tradition of student-led drama performances and worked over the summer to prepare *The Crucible* for presentation. Hazel Ward, a Grade 13 student currently preparing for her A-Levels, began putting together scripts, organizing rehearsals, costumes, props, and scenery. "*Sometimes the rehearsals were chaotic with students as young as Grade 6, but it was challenging and everyone seemed to have fun."*

The student leadership team was completed by James Murray, currently a freshman at Randolph-Macon College in Ashland, Virginia, USA with a quadruple major in English, Economics, Political Science and Drama. Murray returned from the US to produce the drama and to star in its lead role.

Students organized all aspects of the performance from rehearsals two to three times per week starting in October to coordinating use of the stage with the Exam Office. Parents gave constructive criticism, and helped by sewing costumes and finding necessary props. Since many of the students were acting for the first time, Bowers and Ward used improvised acting games as warm-ups before moving on to rehearsal of the long, difficult lines of the play. The *ISF* students even covered their costs and made a small profit which will be used for the next *ISF* Players performance.

ISF Student Life Coordinator, Stephan Michaud, who watched this endeavor take shape, was pleased to see the enthusiastic student and public reception of the project. "*We always say that Student Life gives the students the skills to succeed in college. The reality is that these students are learning more life skills in high school than many do in an entire lifetime."*

SICS Senior Student Applies for the Congressional Page Program

In early December 2005, Ms. Mary Jo Pham, a junior at *the* SABIS[®] *International Charter School in Springfield, Massachusetts*, was appointed as a *Democratic Congressional House Page for the United States House of Representatives*. The Congressional page program is an on-the-job program that exposes high school juniors to the inner workings of the U.S. Congress. The program began in 1829 when Senator Daniel Webster appointed the first Senatorial page. The first House pages began their service in 1842.



"I'm very excited and completely honored at the prospect of living, working, and studying in the heart of America's democracy. My appointment as a page is a definite milestone and I am very grateful to everyone, especially SABIS[®], for encouraging me and supporting my amibitions," said Ms. Pham. She is sponsored by the Honorable Richard E. Neal of Massachusetts' Second Congressional District and is one out of twenty-four Democratic Congressional pages from across the United States. The page program has a total of seventy-two pages with forty-two pages sponsored by the majority party and twenty-four pages sponsored by the minority party.

The page work schedule changes daily but maintains a challenging line of work. *"It will be an unforgettable experience. Page work varies and ranges from answering telephones to delivering messages to assisting some of the greatest orators of our time,"* Ms. Pham stated. Pages live on Capitol Hill and attend school in *the Thomas Jefferson Building of the Library of Congress.* The U.S. House Page School begins promptly at 6:45 AM, prior to the convening of the House. Twice a month, pages attend special Saturday classes designed to provide hands-on learning experiences around Washington, D.C.

Ms. Pham will be in Washington, D.C. from the end of January 2006 until the beginning of June 2006.
