Be confident in knowing that you have developed the necessary skills to reach even greater personal heights."





Major Expansion in the SABIS® School Network



Ten new schools joined the SABIS® School Network in the 2006-07 academic year and will increase the network to 41 schools in 14 countries.

The International School of Choueifat - Erbil, Kurdistan in Iraq is the result of a public-private partnership initiated by the Ministry of Education, who formed a private company and contracted with SABIS® for the operation of the school.

In an innovative public-private education project, SABIS® will manage six kindergarten and primary schools in the Emirates of Abu Dhabi and Al Ain, UAE. This joint educational venture will make a positive contribution to the future of public education and will reinforce SABIS®'s position as an organization dedicated to the educational development in the region.

The International School of Choueifat - Manama in the Kingdom of Bahrain is a non-selective, coeducational school which has opened for KG-Grade 8 students on September 3, 2006. It will promote effective teaching, student participation, and encourage students to perform to the best of their abilities.

In addition to the schools which will join the SABIS® School Network in 2006-07, plans are well underway for expansion in the 2007-08 year. In September 2007, the Shanghai United International School - Min Hang in China will cater for Chinese and international students in grades 6-12. The school is the result of a joint venture between SABIS® and the Xiehe Education Group. The school will provide all students with a high-quality education allowing them access to universities worldwide.

All these schools will provide a high-quality, college-preparatory education for all students, based on the SABIS® Educational System.

Feature School



International Academy of Flint - Michigan

The International Academy of Flint (IAF) became a member of the SABIS® School Network when it opened its doors in August 1999 to 602 students in kindergarten through Grade 8. Later, IAF moved into a remodelled school building on South Saginaw Street and experienced a revitalized interest from local families.

IAF is now a full K-12 school serving 901 students in AY 2006-07. The Academy is viewed as more than a typical school and parents throughout the community are eager for their children to attend the school which is known for its high academic standards as well as its ongoing contributions to community improvement.



Academics

The International Academy of Flint students benefit from a rigorous college-preparatory environment based on the SABIS® curriculum, an interactive and dynamic curriculum which provides a wellrounded education based on the mastery of English, mathematics, sciences, and world languages.

In the fall of 2005, IAF students in grades 3-8 completed their state level examination - or MEAP Michigan Educational Assessment Program - Exam. IAF students outperformed the local district in all grades and subjects tested. They also surpassed the state average in grades 3, 4, 6, and 8 in English Language Arts and Social Studies.

IAF students also take the Performance Series Test - PST. Students in grades 3-12 take this computerized, criterion-referenced test which measures reading and math growth over the course of one academic year. Recent results showed that IAF students outperformed Central Michigan University's average charter school yearly growth in all grades, in both subjects. The IAF students' growth rate also exceeded the national average for all grades tested in both reading and math.



SABIS® Student Life Organization™

The SABIS® Student Life Organization™ is the driving force at *IAF* whether it is athletics, academics, or clubs and activities. All students are encouraged to join this mini-society and to take an active part in their education, both at the academic and the non-academic levels. Working in cooperation with and complementing the efforts of the administrative and academic staff, prefects are valuable assets to the school. The activities of the SABIS® SLO™ bring major advantages. Students learn to become responsible and caring citizens.

On the academic front, the SLO has taken a lead role in automatically helping all the students who need academic support in order to ensure their success and the success of IAF. Moreover, the SLO has created a culture of achievement that was unheard of and promoted the "It's cool to be smart" theme throughout the school.

Dances, sports tournaments, and the ever-popular "Friday Night Live", are just a few of the events hosted by the SABIS® SLO™ at IAF. Friday Night Live provides students an opportunity to play sports, dance, play video games, and utilize the computer lab.

The SABIS® SLO™ at IAF also plays an active role in discipline and the improvement of behavior in the school, through the establishment of a formal mentoring program for the lower school and a similar, although less formal, program for the upper school. Furthermore, study groups examine various theories of leadership and youth development.

The athletic program at the International Academy of Flint is growing by leaps and bounds. IAF is part of the Michigan High School Athletic Association and competes in basketball, cross country, and track and field. Activities are also offered in wrestling, spirit team (cheerleading), and baseball.

In only three years of varsity competition, IAF has established itself in both girls' and boys' basketball competition. Both varsity teams made it to the MHSAA District championship game in 2005-2006.

Despite being one of the smaller high schools in the state, *IAF* teams regularly compete against schools up to twelve times its size. *IAF* plans to continue strengthening its basketball program as teams are fielded on many levels: varsity, junior varsity, junior high, and elementary.

Law Day 2006

Each year, the Genesee County Mock Trial Law Day, sponsored by the Genesee County Bar Association, is celebrated with mock trial competition between county high schools. This event begins with the presentation of a case by the Bar Association. The facts of the case are sent to participating area high schools, who select a team of students to perform as attorneys, witnesses, and jury members. In preparing for the Law Day, students also work together with a member of the Genesee County Bar Association.

On Law Day 2006, *IAF* won their mock case for the second year in a row. "This is a great event that *IAF* plans to continue in the future to experience real-life work and responsibilities," commented *IAF* Director, Mrs. T. Cormier. "This is another event that helps our students acquire and refine the skills, attitudes, and attributes that give them an edge in the world."

The Arts

The performing arts are an important part of *IAF*. A favorite event showcasing the arts at *IAF* is the annual talent show for grades K-12. The 2006 show featured twenty-five well-rehearsed and loudly applauded acts which included folk dancing, hip-hop dancing, instrumentals, dance groups, and a variety of solo and group vocal acts





Prom

The junior and senior classes of *IAF* celebrated prom in style with a dinner cruise on *the Detroit Princess*. The four-decked ship sailed the Detroit River while beautifully attired staff and students danced the night away. A buffet that included carved roast beef and stuffed salmon as well as delectable and endless trays of petite desserts was enjoyed by all. The enchanted evening ended with all revelers enjoying a beautiful sunset and an all-around wonderful evening.

The International Academy of Flint celebrated its 3rd graduation on June 3, 2006. Fifteen graduates were awarded their high school diploma in front of a crowd of gathered *IAF* staff, friends, and family. Selected by the graduating class as the staff speaker, Mrs. Ulishney delivered a heartfelt, personalized speech to the class before the seniors were presented with their diplomas marking the end of a long journey. A 2005 graduate of *the International School of Choueifat - Abu Dhabi*, Ms. Joanna Abousleiman credits *ISC-AD* for her success and for contributing to enriching her life experiences.

Joanna joined *ISC-Abu Dhabi*, as a fifth grader in the fall of 1997 and graduated in 2005. She is currently finishing her freshman year at Brown University in Providence, Rhode Island and has many fond memories of the eight years she spent at *ISC-Abu Dhabi*.

"The people I met and the experiences we shared have been instrumental in getting me where I am today. Studying at ISC-Abu Dhabi allowed me to get to know and work closely with so many fantastic people."

At *ISC-Abu Dhabi*, Joanna greatly benefited from the wide range of academic courses. She had the chance to explore diverse subject areas, ranging from English literature to business studies and computer science. These learning opportunities created a culture that promoted experimentation and academic risk-taking, two fundamental values Joanna brought with her to Brown University. In addition to this open culture, years of frequent SABIS® Academic Monitoring System™ tests taught her to handle academic pressure and to face her college workload. "These days, I find myself to be among the least stressed-out people at Brown when exam time comes around."

One of the pillars of the school's system is the SABIS® Student Life Organization $^{\text{TM}}$, which provides an excellent framework for building relationships among students and administrators. During her time at $ISC-Abu\ Dhabi$, Joanna worked in almost every department of the SABIS® SLO^{TM} , "The SABIS® SLO^{TM} gave me a chance to learn teamwork, organize events, and be involved in various capacities over the course of my education." Her tasks ranged from being a door prefect to running a craft club for third and fourth graders to teaching.
