# **Spotlight on ISC-Lahore's Student Achievements**



ISC-Lahore Students Honored at *LUMS Psi-Fi Olympiad* Appreciation Ceremony

Through the comprehensive SABIS<sup>®</sup> Educational System including a world-class curriculum, SABIS<sup>®</sup> students acquire a broad foundation of knowledge on which they can build a successful future. Demonstrating the solidity of their academic skills, students at the International School of Choueifat-Lahore in Pakistan had a successful 2010-11 academic year that included several notable achievements.

In math and science, ISC-Lahore students succeeded in several external competitions. Most noteworthy, at the nation-wide 2<sup>nd</sup> Annual Psi-Fi Olympiad organized by the Lahore University of Management Sciences, 19 ISC-Lahore

students on four teams impressively competed among 650 teams. In fact, during the five-day event held earlier this year, two ISC-Lahore teams placed first and third out of 650 teams in the *Tour de Mind* category, which tested students' general knowledge, logic, mathematics, and physics, among others.

In another category, *Race to Infinity*, a scavenger hunt based on IQ intelligence and math knowledge involving more than 150 teams, an ISC-Lahore team was awarded second place, while another made it into the top 10. Moreover, in the *Math Gauge* category, a complex mathematical test including problem-solving and logical deduction, an ISC-Lahore team competed among 150 teams and placed third while another earned the fifth place position. "*We are very pleased with the results and proud of our students who put tremendous effort into numerous external competitions this year. This is great encouragement for future students who will participate in challenging competitions," commented ISC-Lahore Director, Ms. Margo Abdel Aziz.*

ISC-Lahore students also demonstrated their mathematical prowess in an online competition. During *World Math Day* held online in the spring of 2011, ISC-Lahore students were part of the more than 5 million students who competed against each other around the globe. In each game, the students had one minute to answer as many math questions as they could. While playing a game, the website attempted to find other players of the same level to match the player against. If no matches were found, the player played against a computer. In the 14-18 year old division, rising senior, Dilsher Ahmed, who entered ISC-Lahore as a KG2 student in 1999, earned 5,532 points and ranked 11<sup>th</sup> in the world and 1<sup>st</sup> in Pakistan for his math aptitude.

Additionally, his fellow classmates took the 6<sup>th</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup>, and 16<sup>th</sup> place spots nationwide.

Furthermore, in March 2011, 16 ISC-Lahore students in grades 9-12 participated in the 7<sup>th</sup> Annual International Kangaroo Mathematics Contest organized by Mathematics without Borders and the Pakistan Kangaroo Commission. The contest involved a math exam that tested students' creativity and logical thinking. Remarkably, Dilsher again rose to the challenge and was recognized as a top winner within the country. For his efforts, he was invited to an all-expense-paid, nine-day summer camp program in Romania this past summer.

In language arts, ISC-Lahore students partook in the *World Spelling Day* in March. The online competition attracting students worldwide gave students a chance to engage in live games of spelling. Each game lasted for 60 seconds and students could play up to 100 games to earn points for their personal tally. Showcasing his skills acquired through the SABIS<sup>®</sup> Educational System and the core language of English, Dilsher ranked 28<sup>th</sup> in the world and 3<sup>rd</sup> in Pakistan, scoring a total of 1,969 points.

Other achievements include the school's class of 2011 members—55 in total of whom 50 were accepted to college or university, with the remaining five staying at ISC-Lahore to complete the A-Level General Certificate of Education program, a required qualification for entry into British universities. For those going on to university, the solid academic foundation and achievements made during their time at ISC-Lahore paved their way to acceptances to several top universities worldwide including Pennsylvania State University, Purdue University, Boston University, New York University, Lahore University of Management Sciences, and University of Nottingham, among many others.

Commenting on the extraordinary achievements of ISC-Lahore students, Ms. Abdel Aziz said, "In my view, the value of our students' achievements is much higher than in many other countries. These students live with a sense of constant instability, declining living conditions, heavy rolling blackouts, meaning at times they need to study during the night since there is no power otherwise available—things students elsewhere take for granted. But our students have enormous wells of

determination to achieve and we feel so much respect and pride for them to face many challenges with courage and unusual strength for young people."

# SICS's Class of 2011 Awarded \$9 Million in Scholarships

SABIS<sup>®</sup> students and graduates are continuously being recognized for their academic aptitude and often are recipients of enviable college scholarships for their achievements. The recent graduates from the SABIS<sup>®</sup> International Charter School (SICS) in Springfield, Massachusetts, are no exception. In addition to becoming the 11<sup>th</sup> consecutive class of graduates with a 100% acceptance rate to college and university, SICS's class of 2011 was awarded a total of **\$9 million** in scholarships.

to pay for college has become a challenge. Fortunately, members of the Class of 2011 have the skills and academic prowess to make attending college more financially accessible," Mr. Campagna explained.

Not only are SICS seniors awarded scholarships based on merit, but often their financial need is considered as well. One such scholarship program, the MassMutual Scholarship, recently announced their recipients, and out of the 40 available awards, six SICS graduates earned \$5,000 awards, renewable for four years. The awards were given to students who maintained a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or above, demonstrated financial need, and planned to pursue a career in financial services, business, or information technology. "*Our students are very deserving of the MassMutual awards and all the other scholarships they have received. We are very proud of their ongoing success!*" stated SICS Director, Ms. Karen Reuter.

Ms. Stephanie Morin, a 2011 graduate of SICS who is enrolled at Bay Path College, credits SABIS<sup>®</sup> for helping to make a college education financially viable. "SABIS<sup>®</sup> has not only prepared me to be successful academically, it provided me with dedicated college counselors who made me aware of a great number of scholarships and also provided me and my family the help to complete the financial aid process successfully," said Ms. Morin.

SICS graduates who recently received scholarships represent only a fraction of the SABIS<sup>®</sup> students worldwide who have been awarded funding this year for their accomplishments, including those in academics and sports. # Stellar AP<sup>®</sup> Results across the Network

Through the dynamic SABIS<sup>®</sup> Educational System and its rich curriculum, students are prepared to master a variety of subjects and excel on a number of external exams, facilitating their entry to the world's most competitive universities.

As such, every year across the SABIS<sup>®</sup> School Network, students sit for the U.S.-based Advanced Placement<sup>®</sup> (AP<sup>®</sup>) exams. Administered by the College Board, AP<sup>®</sup> exams are offered across 22 subject areas, including mathematics, physics, biology, and literature, among others, and measure students' capabilities to perform at the collegiate level. The AP<sup>®</sup> tests are scored on a 1 to 5 scale, with 5 as the highest score denoting that a student has mastered the material. Over the years, SABIS<sup>®</sup> students have recorded impressive results on AP<sup>®</sup> exams, and the results from the 2011 spring exams were no different.

### Germany

In Germany at ISF Internationale Schule Frankfurt-Rhein-Main, nine of the 12 students, or 75%, who sat for AP<sup>®</sup> exams scored a three or higher on at least one test. Moreover, one ISF student was recognized by the College Board as an AP<sup>®</sup> Scholar, signifying that the student received scores of three or higher on three or more AP<sup>®</sup> exams. Plus, two ISF students earned the AP<sup>®</sup> Scholar with Honor title, meaning they earned scores of three or higher on four or more exams and an average of 3.25 on all exams taken, while six ISF students received the AP<sup>®</sup> Scholar with Distinction title for their scores of three or higher on five or more exams and an average of 3.5 on all AP<sup>®</sup> exams taken. Additionally, the 12 students, who took a total of 66 exams, earned a 4 or higher on 48 of the exams, or 73%.

#### U.A.E.

SABIS<sup>®</sup> students in the Gulf region did as well as their counterparts in Germany. In the U.A.E. at the International School of Choueifat-Abu Dhabi, 80 of the 152 students, or 53%, who sat for AP<sup>®</sup> exams impressively earned a three or higher on three exams or more. Specifically, 24 students earned the AP<sup>®</sup> Scholar recognition, 27 received the AP<sup>®</sup> Scholar with Honor title, and 29 were acknowledged as AP<sup>®</sup> Scholars with Distinction. Also in the U.A.E., the International School of Choueifat-Dubai had noteworthy results. There, 62 of the 146 students, or 42%, who sat for exams scored three or higher on three or more exams, with 22 AP<sup>®</sup> Scholars, 19 AP<sup>®</sup> Scholars with Honor, and 21 AP<sup>®</sup> Scholars with Distinction.

The other SABIS<sup>®</sup> member schools across the U.A.E. also had stellar results. At the International School of Choueifat-Sharjah, 42 of the 80 students, or 53%, who sat for the AP<sup>®</sup> exams secured AP<sup>®</sup> Scholar status with varying distinctions, including 19 AP<sup>®</sup> Scholars, 13 AP<sup>®</sup> Scholars with Honor, and 10 AP<sup>®</sup> Scholars with Distinction. At the International School of Choueifat-Al Ain, 51% of the students sitting for the exam received AP<sup>®</sup> Scholar recognition, with five AP<sup>®</sup> Scholars, nine AP<sup>®</sup> Scholars with Honor, and eight AP<sup>®</sup> Scholars with Distinction. Plus, at the International School of Choueifat-Ruwais there were seven AP<sup>®</sup> Scholars among the school's 12 test takers, including three AP<sup>®</sup> Scholars with Distinction. And at the International School of Choueifat-Abu Dhabi Khalifa City A, there was one AP<sup>®</sup> Scholar and three AP<sup>®</sup> Scholars with Honor among the school's 14 students who sat for the exams.

#### Gulf

Nearby in Oman, the International School of Choueifat-Muscat reported two AP<sup>®</sup> Scholars, and in Qatar at the International School of Choueifat-Doha, eight of the 15 students, or 53%, who sat for the AP<sup>®</sup> exams were recognized for their performance, including six acknowledged as AP<sup>®</sup> Scholars, one AP<sup>®</sup> Scholar with Honor, and one AP<sup>®</sup> Scholar with Distinction. In Saudi Arabia at Riyadh-based Abdul Aziz International School, 17 of the 19 students, or 89%, who sat for the exams earned scores of three or higher on at least one exam, plus the school reported three AP<sup>®</sup> Scholars, one AP<sup>®</sup> Scholar with Honor, and one AP<sup>®</sup> Scholar with Distinction.

# Egypt

In Egypt at the International School of Choueifat-City of 6 October, six of the seven students, or 86%, who took AP<sup>®</sup> exams earned a three or higher on at least one exam, with two of them recognized as AP<sup>®</sup> Scholars and one as an AP<sup>®</sup> Scholar with Honor. Also in Egypt, at the International School of Choueifat-Cairo, 19 of the 23 students, or 83%, who sat for the exam impressively received a score of 4 or higher on one exam or more. Furthermore, three students were recognized as AP<sup>®</sup> Scholars with Honor, while two others earned the title of AP<sup>®</sup> Scholar.

#### Lebanon

In Lebanon at the International School of Choueifat-Koura, seven of the eight students who sat for the AP<sup>®</sup> exams earned a three or higher on at least on exam, while at the International School of Choueifat-Choueifat all of the four students who sat for the AP<sup>®</sup> exams received a four or higher on at least one exam with two students recognized as AP<sup>®</sup> Scholars. And at SABIS<sup>®</sup> International School-Adma, both of the two students who sat for exams earned a four or higher on at least one exam with one of them earning AP<sup>®</sup> Scholar recognition.

#### **Pakistan and Jordan**

Rounding out the extraordinary AP<sup>®</sup> exam results from the 2010-11 academic year are the SABIS<sup>®</sup> member schools in Pakistan and Jordan. The International School of Choueifat-Lahore reported six AP<sup>®</sup> Scholars, three AP<sup>®</sup> Scholars with Honor, and one AP<sup>®</sup> Scholar with

Distinction. At the International School of Choueifat-Amman, there were two AP<sup>®</sup> Scholars, with two of the three students who sat for exams there earning a four or higher on at least one exam.

The 2010-11 AP<sup>®</sup> exam results reflect SABIS<sup>®</sup>'s commitment to providing students with a well-rounded education that positions them to excel in their academic pursuits, including on external exams.

# **Class of 2010 College and University Acceptances**



In line with SABIS<sup>®</sup>'s belief that higher education should be academically accessible to almost all students and not just a select few, SABIS<sup>®</sup> strives to provide its students with a solid foundation of knowledge, skills,

and experiences that facilitates their pursuit of tertiary education. In doing so, SABIS<sup>®</sup> equips students with the tools needed to sit for a variety of university qualifying exams in order to gain admission to colleges and universities around the world.

As such, members of the Class of 2010 from schools across the SABIS<sup>®</sup> School Network have fully reaped the benefits of the SABIS<sup>®</sup> Educational System and have just completed their first year at some of the most prestigious colleges and universities worldwide. Combined, these students were accepted to more than 360 colleges and universities in 29 countries on five continents.

In the U.S. alone, SABIS<sup>®</sup>'s 2010 graduates were accepted to 180+ colleges and universities including American University, Boston University, Brown University, Columbia University, Georgetown University, MIT, Rice University, and Stanford University, among others.

Across the pond, in the U.K., SABIS<sup>®</sup>'s Class of 2010 gained entry to over 65 colleges and universities including Durham University, Imperial College London, King's College London, LSE, University of Exeter, University of Nottingham, and University of York, among many others. University in Spain, Carnegie Mellon University in Qatar, and Business School Lausanne in Switzerland.

# SABIS® IT Division Earns ISO Certification

For more than a century, SABIS<sup>®</sup> has been committed to making a difference through education, a commitment that is facilitated through its cutting-edge software development and services. The organization's use of information technology consistently contributes to the optimization of learning, improvement of academic results, enhancement of teacher efficiency, and reinforcement of communication across the schools in the global SABIS<sup>®</sup> School Network.

Given its commitment to continuously set industry standards in the use of IT, the SABIS<sup>®</sup> IT Division has—since February 2010—been engaged in aligning its processes to ISO (International Organization for Standardization) standards. Notably, less than a year and a half after starting the project, SABIS<sup>®</sup> was awarded the internationally-recognized ISO 9001:2008 certification and joins only 350,000 companies worldwide who have been distinguished with this certification. This achievement comes on the heels of the division's CMMI Level 3 certification in July 2010.

Gaining ISO 9001:2008 certification required the SABIS<sup>®</sup> IT Division to enhance its Quality Management System (QMS) processes across four areas—Software Development, IT Infrastructure, IT Operations, and HR practices related to IT—in order to comply with the ISO standard. "In line with ISO requirements, SABIS<sup>®</sup> provided clear and effective processes among its operations, verifying efficiency and bolstering its mission to deliver cutting-edge educational software and services," commented SABIS<sup>®</sup> Group Vice President-Information Technology, Books Publishing, and Creative Design, Mr. Serge Bakhos.

"In addition to promoting literacy among the homeless boys, we aimed for ISC-6 October students to have the chance to lead, assist in teaching, manage, and support the boys during the camp," added Ms. Abodouma.*  Demonstrating that the camp's aims were met, one ISC-6 October student said, "We learned the importance of giving back to others instead of taking; that all are equal, homeless or not; that we can actually make a difference by teaching so that knowledge will spread all over...And finally we realized that we aren't the only ones on this planet and that all people around us are important." One of the camp's participants said, "This camp is great...they teach us well. They have helped me to have a strong will." Another camp participant, Mohammad, said, "We had a great time. The staff and ISC students were very helpful and nice...actually everything about the camp was nice!"

Although the summer camp has ended, ISC-6 October staff members plan to check in with the boys once a month to see their progress. Additionally, the school hopes to offer a similar summer camp program to underprivileged children next year.

Serving a majority of minority students, both these schools demonstrate the value of the SABIS® Educational System in raising the bar academically and addressing the ethnic and economic achievement gap experienced across communities in the U.S.

In fact, the academic performance among the schools' students is often on par with their Caucasian counterparts, and in some cases higher, according to the results of 35 state exams administered

to students in grades 3-11 at the schools. Combined, these two schools closed the African-American—Caucasian gap on 14 of the 35 exams or 40%. Also, together, these two schools had a narrower African-American—Caucasian gap in 19 of the 35 exams or 54%. Therefore, on 94% of the tests, SICS and IAF either closed the gap completely or were more successful than their two host states in closing the gap. Moreover, the state tests found that minority and low-income students attending SICS and IAF were outperforming their states' Caucasian and economically-advantaged peers by the time they reach the 10<sup>th</sup> grade.

Beyond success on state exams, students at SICS and IAF have demonstrated their academic competence in other ways. For instance, SICS's 126-strong Class of 2011 not only all gained entry to college or university, but they were awarded a total of \$9 million in scholarships. Additionally, 43 of the 63 students, or 68%, who sat for AP<sup>®</sup> exams in May 2011 at SICS received a score of three or higher on at least one exam, plus three students were recognized as AP<sup>®</sup> Scholars. IAF has seen similar academic success among its students, with its 2011 graduating class having earned more than \$425,000 in scholarships, plus earning

In the 29 years since graduating from the International School of Choueifat-Choueifat, Dr. Ali H. Sayed has received multiple engineering degrees, including a doctoral degree from Stanford University, authored five books, published over 350 scientific articles, and been the recipient of several international prizes and recognitions.

Today, Dr. Sayed serves as a Professor of Electrical Engineering and Director of the Adaptive Systems Laboratory at the University of California, Los Angeles (UCLA) and is renowned worldwide for both his expertise and specialized textbooks in the areas of adaptation and learning. While it is clear he has a natural flair for math and science, he admits it was solidified at ISC-Choueifat in what Dr. Sayed calls a "rigorous and engaging educational program". Dr. Sayed explained, "The program at ISC-Choueifat is unique and unmatched. Students are challenged regularly and they need to demonstrate their mastery of the material on a weekly basis. This develops skills that can only serve students well in their future endeavors, as it has done for me," he added.

Through the comprehensive SABIS<sup>®</sup> Educational System, Dr. Sayed not only had the opportunity to explore his math and science interests, but he was able to reach his full academic potential. Sao Paulo in Brazil and a PhD from Stanford University. Pursuing those degrees was no easy feat, but Dr. Sayed was instilled with determination and perseverance that grew out of his familiarity with his alma mater's history. "*The story of ISC is a remarkable tale of survival in a region where uncertainty often reigns. Despite obstacles of enormous proportions including world wars and civil wars, the school stood tall and firm, educating generations of students for over 125 years,"* said Dr. Sayed. "I am one of those students and always remembered that my education is a result of the school's perseverance to operate no matter what," he commented.

In addition to the impressive degrees he holds, Dr. Sayed has been recognized numerous times for his academic success. Most notably, he received the 2005 Frederick Emmons Terman Award from the American Society for Engineering Education, 2005 Distinguished Lecturer-IEEE (The Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers) Signal Processing Society, 2003 Kuwait Prize for Basic Sciences, 2001 Fellow-IEEE, and, 1996 IEEE Donald G. Fink Prize Award, among several others.

Although Dr. Sayed has achieved an extraordinary amount in academia since graduating from ISC-Choueifat in 1982, he continues to contribute to the field of electrical engineering and work toward his professional ambitions. Currently, he is in the final stages of completing a new textbook geared toward students in electrical engineering undergraduate programs, plus conducts research. "At the research level, my laboratory is currently studying complex adaptive networks with cognitive and learning abilities. The diffusion of information across these networks helps create a form of decentralized intelligence that is both intriguing and powerful and is commonly encountered in nature," described Dr. Sayed.

With an unwavering zeal for engineering research, it is clear that Dr. Sayed will go on to make many more valuable contributions to his field. For now, he hopes his ongoing research efforts will help in understanding and reverse-engineering the cognitive abilities and collective behavior that are commonly observed in socio, economic, and biological networks.
